

HOW TO MAKE A SQUISHY BAG

Materials:

- Gallon sized freezer bag
- Cotton ball
- Rubbing alcohol or fingernail polish remover
- Hair gel
- Duct tape
- Items to move around in bag (nothing with sharp edges)
- Food coloring (optional)



Instructions:

- 1. If your freezer bag has any printing on it, use the cotton ball with some rubbing alcohol or fingernail polish remover to remove it.
- 2. Squeeze some hair gel into the bag so that there is a nice even covering inside the bag but so that it is not over-filled
- 3. Optional: Add a little food coloring if you want, but be careful not to make the color too dark because you need to be able to see what's under the bag. Close the bag and gently work in the food coloring.
- 4. Place in the bag whatever filler you need for the activities you will be completing (beads, pompoms, etc.)
- 5. Close up the bag, squeezing out any extra air bubbles and secure the top of the bag with duct tape. Also tape off the sides of the top so that no gel can't be squeezed out during play.

- Alphabet beads

- Squishy bag ready to use but not taped closed yet


Instructions:

Print out the sheet you would like to use and tape it to a desktop. For best results if you are going to re-use it over and over again, laminate the activity sheet.


Then tape the prepared squishy bag over top of the printable. The best kind of tape to use for this is clear packing tape.

- Squishy bag ready to use but not taped closed yet


Instructions:


Print out the sheet you would like to use and tape it to a desktop. For best results if you are going to re-use it over and over again, laminate the activity sheet.

- Packing tape


Instructions:


Take one of your large squishy bags that are just plain without any extra filling, like beads or pompoms.


Print out the sheet you would like to use and tape it to a desktop. For best results if you are going to re-use it over and over again, laminate the activity sheet.


Then tape the prepared squishy bag over top of the printable. The best kind of tape to use is clear packing tape.


